January 2018 Governing Body update

A question I have been asked by friends, family and other parents is 'What does a governor do?' I thought it would be good to start the new year with a brief explanation.

The governing board consists of nine governors (3 staff, 4 parents and 2 independent). Generally, governors do not act independently, but work as a team with three primary goals:

- Overseeing financial performance reviewing the short and long term budgetary strategy
- Holding the head to account checking that the educational performance of the school is good
- Vision and strategy ensuring that the school has and follows, a strategic, ethical and moral directions

To do this, we have a number of meetings each term, as well as taking advantage of Herts for Learning (HfL) training sessions, guidance sessions, visiting the school during term time and keeping abreast of the changes in the education world.

With Mrs Elsley's imminent departure, we are now, as a governing body, tasked with the job of finding the next head, one that will uphold the morals and values which the school embodies and continue to make it a better place for our children without a doubt there are big shoes to fill, however, we are committed to finding the right person.

When I applied for the role in 2016, I had an inkling of what was involved, there would be a time commitment and tea at some point. What I hadn't realised was how interesting and rewarding the role would be or how much I would learn. It has been a fascinating journey so far and one I am very passionate about and I look forward to continuing in the next year!

Applying for a Nursery Place in for 2017-2018

If your child was born between 1st Sept 2014 and 31st Aug 2015 it is now time to apply for a Nursery place.

How do I apply?

Our application form for Nursery places for September 2018 is on our school website <u>www.monksmead.herts.sch.uk/parents/admissions</u>. You can apply for a nursery place from the **1st February 2018** to **16th March 2018**.

Parents will need to fill in parts of the form before returning it to the school office. Incomplete applications will not be considered as part of the nursery admissions.

How are applications considered?

Once the closing date has arrived, we will then consider all the applications made. It there are less than 30 applications made, all offers will be made. If we receive more applications, then the following will be applied.

- 1. Does your child have an EHCP?
- 2. Is your child a looked after child?
- 3. Does your child have any medical or social reasons why Monksmead is the school they should go to?
- 4. Does your child have a sibling in the school?
- 5. Are you taking up the 30 hour offer?
- 6. The distance you live from the school.

To be eligible for criteria 1-3, further documents will be required at the point of application. If these are not sent in with the application form, these criterias will not be considered.
